This rally is unique in that it has both a touring rally and a hub rally, offering a variety of exceptional day rides coupled with the relaxation of three nights at Lajitas Resort. Once at the resort you can go on ½ day rides or full day rides or just lay about the pool. This rally has limited registration so sign up early. Registration will close on April 2 2023. The ride starts in El Paso Texas and ends at the Lajitas Resort. If you want a Top Shelf Rally, this is it. Also being the first of May, it shouldn't be too HOT.

Next on to The Natchez Trace and More H.O.G. Touring Rally Starts May 9,2023 thru May 14,2023 the Natchez Trace Parkway is one of the older

routes in America. This gorgeous natural environment attracts motorcyclists from all over the world. This rally starts just south of Indianapolis IN. and ends just north of New Orleans at Slidell LA.




