There will be no social gathering organized by the road captain.

I understand and respect each person's rights to wear or not wear protective face coverings. So if you disagree with these guidelines please do not participate in the rides for now. I thank you for your cooperation in advance.

Our first ride is scheduled for Sunday July 12 th; your assistant director Steve Pehargou will be leading us so I'm sure it will be a great route. Jim Strange will lead us to the Fort Bragg area on Friday the 17 th and Mike Rooney will lead us on our first overnight to Burney Saturday and Sunday July 25 & Samp; 26.



This Harley-Davidson motorcycle has no equal, **Harley-Davidson** poured everything they had to ensure that this motorcycle is superior in every way. The 2020 CVO Street Glide is priced at only \$40,539.

Custom Finishes

The lower fairings protect your legs and house two of the six Boom! stage II speakers.

The bike comes with round analog gauges, indicator lights, and LED screens that give the bike a more traditional feel.

And who can forget that beautiful vented Batwing fairing? The mirrors are mounted on the inner fairing to complement the low-profile windshield.

The Harley-Davidson CVO Street Glide also comes with a six-gallon fuel tank that has a 246-mile range, making it ideal for those cross-country trips. The hard-side bags have 2.4 cubic feet of storage space and are extremely easy to open. The vertical LED lights complete the look.

Daymaker Adaptive LED Headlamp

The Daymaker Adaptive headlamp has patented sensors and electronics that are integrated into the headlamp control. The headlamp has 12 additional LED lights that activate based on the angle of the bike when cornering. The headlamp is designed to reduce wasted light that can affect oncoming traffic.
